

Fact sheet: Pediatric Services

Key Points in History

- 2008** 65-bed Level 3 NICU opens at CRMC
- 2011** 19 beds added to CRMC's Level 3 NICU; total 84
- 2015** UCSF Benioff and Community Medical Centers enter agreement to increase access to pediatric subspecialists here
- 2016** 10-bed PICU opens at Community Regional
- 2018** Community Pediatric Specialty Center, partnered with UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital and UCSF Fresno, opened in downtown Fresno and is located on the third floor of the North Medical Plaza. It was designed specifically for kids and offering more than a dozen distinct pediatric specialties.

Community Regional and Clovis Community become the first and only hospitals in the Valley to achieve the Joint Commission's Perinatal Care certification.

Community Regional Medical Center: Fiscal Year 2019 Key Figures

Community Regional's Level 3 NICU means we're licensed to care for some of the sickest infants. According to the American Medical Association, studies have shown that extremely premature babies have a 62% increased risk of dying if they are born at a hospital without a Level 3 NICU, compared to those born at a hospital with one.
